We have been in the season of Epiphany since January the 6th. Epiphany is about the cosmic event of God coming to earth as a person and the wonder of the signs and miracles that pointed towards his birth through the ages. It is initially signaled with the celebration by the magi who, through prophecy and study, were led by a

star to Jesus in Bethlehem. We ask ourselves at this time "how does God come to us?" "How does God lead us?" We may also say "how do we see God?" or experience him not only through scripture and prophecy but in the miraculous things. This may happen in our living or that we see around us. As we are living every day in his world as His creation do we see his hand at work?

We have a sign in our home that says "God does not cause the storm to pass but teaches us to dance in the rain". Since we have three more weeks in Epiphany, I would ask you to observe, look, and see how God is at work around you and those you love. Do you see your prayers answered or are they heard by others and by God? Do you find the fellowship of the church and the presence of the Holy Spirit giving you comfort and peace? In the midst of trials do you look deep down in yourself and see that God is with you? How is God teaching you to dance in the rain?

Certainly not the least of our celebrations and festivities comes after epiphany. The holy season of Lent will start on Ash Wednesday February 22. Now that we have seen the signs of God with us, Emmanuel, we are driven to repent. Lent is about introspection and repentance. Thinking ourselves not worthy of God to dwell with us, he does anyway and he becomes flesh and blood and spirit. With a gift like that, what else can we do but be driven to repentance and again return to God, if we have strayed, and find fellowship, communion, and relationship with him and within His bride of Christ, the church and the fellowship that we have as believers.

Now knowing God is really with us, for Lent we take into account what we have done and what we have left undone. Joel 2; 12 puts it this way when he says "yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your hearts, with fasting, with weeping, and with morning; return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding and steadfast love, and relents from punishing." Now as we approach the season of Easter, which is so holy in the eyes of the church, we are called to repent and return to the Lord. We renew our relationship with him as individuals and as a community, remembering what He has done as we live in His creation every day!

But the nation Judah was named for has been conquered by a cruel king, who says all Jews must conform to Syrian law or risk death. Judah's father takes his whole family away resisting the decree, which ignites a war that ends in his death, so Judah is now in charge of his people. Leah wants nothing but peace. This is the story of the Maccabees told through Leah's eyes, who learns that love requires courage and sacrifice.

In March we will read "And The Shofar Blew" by Francine Rivers. This is the story of Paul and Eunice Hudson. He seemed like the perfect pastor to lead Centerville Christian Church. She seemed like the perfect pastor's wife. All is not as it seems. He packs up his wife and son Tim and they move across the country to do the Lord's work. He was good at his job, turning the church around and making it successful. But he didn't understand his quiet wife. She knows something isn't right and hasn't been for a long time. She goes to God in prayer asking for help as her heart is breaking. This is a story about relationships, the church and God's call on people's lives.
