So here we have it...2022, which many of us including myself thought we would never see. Let us be grateful. Let us celebrate the vision and the future God has given to us. Let us take the risk and reap the reward because the birth of Jesus Christ means that evil will be overcome by good, and that God came to be with us and to choose us as his people. Let us be that people for our creator.
