She also served as an office manager, choir member, as well as participating in many groups and recently as chair of the board as well as other officer positions throughout the years.

Ann Holly succeeded Linda as the chair of the Worship Committee and has been very challenged but doing a tremendous job as the worship chair. The challenge has been to provide a worship service atmosphere in the midst of Covid while making plans for a safe return to the sanctuary. She has reached out and included others in the bell choir as well as involve them in our worship service in creative ways. She has been a part of the congregation for many years, giving valuable service in so many ways to the choir, the board, within various groups, and now as the worship chair.

We are so grateful for the service of each of these three women and as a pastor of First Christian Church of Sebring, Florida I am ever so grateful that they used their gifts here among our congregation to enrich us in our worship and service to both our community and the world!

Brothers and Sisters:

As you recall, our congregation adopted our annual church budget earlier this year. Since that time the church has suffered problems with some of its air conditioning units. Except for some funds designated in the property budget for repairs, these unforeseen major expenses were not included in the adopted budget. We recently had to replace the air conditioning unit for the kitchen at a cost of \$4200. We had \$400 in funds that had been contributed and designated for air conditioning expenses, leaving a balance of \$3800. Two members of the congregation have contributed \$500 each toward this expense, leaving a balance of \$2800. In the past, you have been generous and contributed to our roof repairs, kitchen remodel, lights, and other necessary building projects that have made our church building comfortable and welcoming. You have been faithful in your giving, especially during these unusual, pandemic times. Please consider giving an extra amount now designated for our air conditioning expenses.


