You have not because you ask not." This verse in James 4:2 is often used for a variety of purposes. I am not saying in any way that it is not true. The circumstances around this verse were addressing Christians and their sinful ways. The first part of the verse says "you lust, and have not: you kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain; you fight and war, yet you have not, because you ask

not (KJV). Put into the larger context this passage is more about fighting and war. Perhaps the New Living Translation puts it like we want it when it states: "Yet you don't have what you want because you don't ask God for it."

When we do not ask, there is very little chance we will get what we either need or require. This seems very true in the congregation as people do not jump for joy and volunteer to be Sunday school teachers, board members, elders, deacons, or whatever offices are needed. In organizations outside of the ecclesiastical setting, the same thing is true. When you ask a person to volunteer it gives them a chance to indicate their level of interest, and that allows folks to be more receptive and even joyful.

When we ask, we must not ask for ourselves but for the good of the congregation. It may also be for selfless gifts to others. I think it would be inappropriate to say that we have not won the lottery because we did not ask. It seems selfish to ask to win the lottery and then blame God for not causing that to come true. On the other hand, when we ask for someone else, even in prayer, or for other things that are less selfish, we find those requests happening. Granted, sometimes they are not revealed as we would like.

They may be met in other ways and sometimes those ways cannot be seen. I have found that even after years some folks I have prayed for or counselled have had the gift they needed for their full and faithful lives.

We found this very evident when we had the roof leak and decided to proceed with the repairs. Having limited funds, the board decided to begin a fundraiser. About a third of what we needed was already in the roof fund. Within a week, another third of the funds were raised. That next week, more funds came in until, in a remarkably short time, we had exceeded our goal and were able to begin the process of repair before the rainy season. I think this is an excellent example. When we ask God for help as a congregation we are able to do marvelous things. Let us ask for others as we seek to minister as James would have us in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.


