The other day in Bible Study we had two people come that had attended a few other times. The last time was maybe four months ago. The very knowledgeable lady felt she had a message to tell us, especially me. I was both curious and a little leery as class ended. After the lesson, at first, she did not seem to have that message for me, but as I went to go to the restroom, she asked if I was going to return. I stated I would. Well, after a couple of tasks I had to do, she discussed with me about the need to keep the law, especially the ten commandments. One point was that we should not ignore seventy-five percent of the Bible (the Old Testament) and only considering the other twenty-five percent or so. I may not have emphasized that we did not ignore the Old Testament but clearly stated that we are a New Testament church. Discussion turned to the topic of Christ and what did He actually did when He came? What did it mean to "fulfill the law" and even what did "fulfill" mean.

The thickness of the air seemed to change when I stated John 3:16, that God sent His Son and that we must believe in Him! That belief and response is what God is calling us to do and it is not by the law but by grace we are saved. Well, we never got to that point. The turning point seemed to be that once the discussion began to get away from fulfilling the ten commandments the defenses went up. When she guided the discussion back to the Ten Commandments as that which must first be kept, I stated as before that we are a New Testament Church. Perhaps I should not have said what ended to be the statement I now reflect upon. I stated "Maybe our congregation is not for you! We would be very happy to help you find a congregation that is right for you!" That did not go over well. Maybe it was not the right thing to say even though I still think it is true. If the purpose is to find a church that reflects your views, well our congregation does not!

As I reflected on our conversation and talked with others, I was wrong! She would very likely not be happy in our congregation but FCC Sebring is EXACTLY what she needs! With the personal issues from her past and the struggles she continues to experience, she needs so very much to be accepted, loved, and find wholeness in a congregation and in Jesus Christ as her personal savior. It is a reminder that Jesus came not to bind us to the law but to free us from the law. It is a reminder that it is not the law that will save us from our past but the love of Christ that will set us free. It is a reminder that the law is a millstone to incompleteness but the cross is a path to wholeness! As the word in John's Gospel states "everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life."


